Excellence is a standard in our Career and Technical Education and extra-curricular programs as well. Our Future Farmers of America (FFA) chapter was selected as the #1 chapter in the state of Colorado in 2018. Our Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) chapter was selected as the #1 chapter in the state of Colorado in 2020. Students also achieve in Knowledge Bowl, robotics, National Honor Society, Student Council, band, creative writing, and art education. Our athletic teams have a history of success and consistently make state appearances in volleyball, cheerleading, football, basketball, wrestling, baseball, and track and field.

McClave School District prides itself on innovative approaches to education. The Accelerated Reader program is utilized across all grade levels. While in high school, students can earn college credit while concurrently enrolled at Lamar Community College and complete industry certifications in recognized fields. Pathways to high school graduation are available to fit students desiring general high school education or preparing for universities, community colleges, or work. About the Community

McClave, Colorado, is located in rural Bent County just off of U.S. Highway 50 between the cities of Las Animas and Lamar. Traditionally established as an agricultural community, the town is surrounded by crop fields, and agriculture remains the largest industry followed by state and local government, including the school district which employs 48. The town of McClave is unincorporated and is serviced by Bent County for road and bridge and volunteer fire and EMT services. Two regional hospitals are located within 35 miles along with smaller health and dental clinics within 15 miles of the town.

Recreational opportunities are abundant in our area including hunting, fishing, hiking, camping, water and motor sports, biking, horseback riding, and bird and wildlife watching. John Martin Reservoir State Park is just nine miles from McClave offering access to approximately 10,000 acres of recreational water surface area. Additionally, indoor fitness facilities are located in Las Animas and Lamar. Residents of the Lower Arkansas River Valley never lack for things to do or opportunities to be involved. Within easy driving distance are musical and cultural clubs and events, national goose hunting events, festive parades and celebrations, downtown shopping and concerts, farm markets showcasing locally-grown fruits and vegetables, and an abundance of locally-owned and operated small businesses.

McClave is a welcoming, friendly, family-oriented community that many have specifically chosen to live near because of these attributes and our school district's history of quality. Businesses with store fronts in town include a bank, post office, water districts, a church, a food pantry, and a county shop. Residents gather in these often as neighbors and friends. A recently renovated town park highlights the entrance from the south on Highway 196 while the school district's athletic fields and playground welcome drivers from the north.
